

This book is simply written and illustrated while still providing a good amount of information about the American flag that isn't too overbearing or hard for kids to follow. It includes information such as: what the flag represents/stands for, what the design of the flag represents, where and why we fly the flag, the Pledge of Allegiance, Flag Day, and even a little bit about the first design of the American Flag. No one topic or subject goes on and on and the book reads at a good pace. I used this book to introduce and supplement lessons and also used it as prompts for discussions and activities.
